#### BIKES 4 BOOKS - Report

In 2008, Lynden Lodge embarked on a Bikes 4 Books program and during the year 4 bikes were donated between two Elementary Schools to help encourage 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> grade students to read more books. We also donated two bikes to the Lynden Public Library in support of a library program to encourage 1<sup>st</sup> grade students to apply for library cards and to read library books. These programs were received by the Schools and Library with great enthusiasm and the bikes were credited with increasing reading by the children.

Based on the results in 2008, Lynden Lodge expanded Bikes 4 Books programs and plans to donate 32 bikes. Seven elementary schools were selected to receive the 4 bikes each and 4 bikes are to be donated to the Lynden Public Library. The seven schools will receive 2 bikes each shortly and those bikes will be awarded at assemblies before the school year ends this summer. Each school will receive another two bikes soon after school starts in the fall and those bikes will be awarded before Christmas Break.

The Lynden Public Library will develop two reading programs this year, probably one during the summer and the other when school starts in the fall. Lynden lodge will donate two bikes for each. program.

Lynden Lodge was fortunate to receive a substantial donation from Wal-Mart, which will help to make these 2009 programs possible when added to the funds provided in our budget. Bro. Claude Weadon is Chairman of the Lynden Lodge Bikes 4 Books programs this year and assisted by WB Glenn Boodey.
