We met over lunch following the MLA meetings at the Maplewood Masonic Hall to plan our "attack" on 131 applications, by forming into 6 judging teams of 3 each, two for the 46 boys and four for the 85 girls (while I entered all the scores into a computer spreadsheet for "crunching"). In a little over three hours the work was done. My heart-felt thanks for go to the following judges:

The reason for judging all applications in one day was to improve consistency and build "Team Spirit." We certainly accomplished both and learned how to do it even better next year. Our MLA leadership also saw the benefit of bringing in more Masons to their monthly meeting. However, we did not actually judge ALL the applications, only those from 8 of the 9 high schools. The ninth school will be judged by the Lynden team in the "old" method. After their work is completed another set of volunteers will then select the school scholarship winners between the top boy and girl and the top scholarship winners overall.
