For DATA Hounds ONLY

OK Brothers, for those of you don't have a favorite board or card game or who can't simply let go of data-gathering here is a very interesting website produced and updated daily by *The Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation* that may interest you. The charts are for the USA in general as well as for each individual state. Dr. Fauci said the CDC and the White House monitor these charts daily.

There are three charts for each state, plus three for the country as a whole, select-able from the drop down menu located above the info for "state-mandated social distancing." The charts depict:

- (1) hospital resources available vs resources needed on any given date If you move your cursor the figures change for each day, so you can see what's expected to happen. This is the same for all charts.
- (2) deaths per day in your state/USA
- (3) total deaths in your state/USA

As an example, using the New York chart: deaths in the state yesterday 28 March were at 940. One week later on April 4th they are projected to be 3,703 (almost 400% increase) Things level off around April 30 for New York. Maine started later, so we don't level off until the end of May.

More info than you may want, but it affords a quick way to check on things in your own state. Sorry if my comments seemed unnecessarily detailed, but I know a few of the people to whom I'm sending this are. . . "chart challenged!" ;-)

<u>WORLDOMETERS.INFO</u> This website displays data from most countries. Running totals are in white boxes and new cases are displayed in yellow. New deaths are displayed in red boxes. Info is updated frequently during each reporting day.

The World page also has hot-links so you can check the data from some particular countries of interest. The USA link displays the individual States and Territories so you can keep track of what's happening across our country. The reporting day begins and ends using GMT.
