Whatcom Lodge Report

Stated Meeting - Our stated meeting was held on November 18th with Twenty-six brothers attending. In addition to the regular business and of the lodge a Second Degree was conferred and four petitions were balloted on.

Balloting: After the degree we balloted on four petitions for Affiliation or Plural membership. In all four cases the results were found to be *Fair*, *Clear* and *Bright.* By this action the Whatcom brethren elected WB Bruce Sterling, Bro. Alan Cheesman, Bro. Marvin Wolff and Bro. Steve Schuman as our newest members. A hearty welcome to All!

Installation of Officers. Whatcom Lodge held its 104th Annual Installation of Officers on Saturday, November 6th. WB Ted Schuman began the ceremony with a fine address (see page 3). WM Larry West concluded his term with a few comments and introduced the installing team. VWB's Glenn Hutchings and John Browne performed as the Installing Officers, WB Bill Hall as Installing Secretary, WB Ted Schuman as Installing Marshal and WB Gary Pitcher was the Installing Chaplain and he gave the Charge to the Master. At the request of our distinguished guests here are opening comments of WB Ted Schuman the opening MC of the 104th Annual Installation of Officers of Whatcom Lodge No. 151:



Good Evening, ladies and gentlemen, and welcome to the 104th installation of Whatcom Lodge. Please be sure you turn off all cell phones before we begin; thank you.

My name is Ted Schuman, and I have been asked to tell you a bit about Masonry and about our lodge, as well. Modern masonry is roughly three hundred years old, and contrary to some TV documentaries you may have seen, we are not really very secret. Buildings with the familiar square and compass can be found in almost every town in America, and in most foreign countries.

You will notice that tonight the officers of the lodge wear tuxedos, in deference to the dignity of our ceremonies as they were originated, centuries ago.

Some of the most famous and influential members of our society have been Masons, including Sir Isaac Newton, Thomas Jefferson, Henry Ford, Benjamin Franklin, John Wayne, Teddy Roosevelt, General Douglas MacArthur, astronaut Buzz Aldrin, and of course, our country's first president – George Washington. What could have attracted these men to Freemasonry?

Very simply, it is the oldest and largest men's fraternal organization in the world, whose purpose is to take good men and help them become better; better men, better husbands and fathers, and better members of the community. We do this with our ritual, by expressing a philosophy of tolerance, brotherly love, aid for one another and complete trust.

While masonry is not a religious organization, it does require a belief in some faith before you can be admitted.

Unlike some other organizations, we do not solicit membership; you have to ask to become a Mason, but once you do there is a tremendous amount of help available to aid you in the completion of your journey. Recently, we have been fortunate to have a steady stream of applicants of all ages for the degrees of Masonry here in Whatcom Lodge. The fellowship and bonding that occurs in our lodge transcends all ages, religious and political affiliations.

Whatcom Lodge supports our community in a number of ways; for years we have awarded educational scholarships to dozens of students, in prior years we have supported local baseball and basketball teams and our members regularly participate in the Annual Masonic Education Council; a local scholarship program right here in Whatcom county.

And as a part of the Grand Lodge of Washington our contributions go toward the support of a retirement home called Landmark on the Sound, near Seattle, where Masons and/or their spouses can be taken care of if there is no one else to see to their needs.

And, finally, we like to eat, as those of you joining us for the dinner after our installation will confirm. Now, without further ado, let start the evening's festivities.
