WB John Greer, passed away on January 1st, 2011. John was a member and Past Master of Nooksack Valley Lodge No. 105

Thelma N. Jeter, passed away on January 2nd, 2011. Thelma was a 50 year member Maple Leaf Chapter No. 58, OES.

Brother Frank J. McKain, a 50 year member of Whatcom Lodge No. 151 passed away on January 12th, 2011. Brother Frank was Initiated on 2/25/1960, Passed on 5/5/1960 and Raised on 1/26/1961.

WB M. H. "Buck" Strickland Jr. passed away on January 12th, 2011. WB Buck began his Masonic career in DeMolay, joining the blue lodge later in life when elected to membership in Whatcom Lodge on St. Patrick's Day in 1997. Brother Buck was Initiated on 4/17/1997, Passed on 5/15/1997 and Raised on 6/19/1997. In addition to serving as Prompter, Chaplain and J & S Wardens Buck served two terms as Worshipful Master in 2002 and 2003. He was a recipient of the Ted King Inspirational Award and recently the Hiram Award. Buck was also an Honorary Member of Lynden Lodge No. 56.

He was very supportive of DeMolay and a few years ago was awarded the DeMolay Legion of Honor Medal for his steadfast support. Bro. Buck was also a supporter of Bethel No. 25 JDI and Evergreen Assembly No. 17 Rainbow Girls.

WB Dr. John Spry passed away on January 13th, 2011. WB John, a Mason for nearly 50 years, was a member of Lynden Int. Lodge No. 56. Doc Spry was Worshipful Master in 1975 and, in recent years, he served faithfully as Tyler and Chaplain.
