

#### MASONIC FAMILY LEADERSHIP ASSOCIATION

Most Masons would agree that there should be a central group which coordinates meetings, events and activities to avoid conflicts in dates and times. The MFLA will do that and more.

The MFLA will conduct workshops sanctioned by Grand Lodge on subjects and topics that are of interest to Masons in District #10. It will conduct sessions to assist Lodges in improving their ritual work. There will be special programs that are interesting and brief.

In addition, no less than the three principal officers of each Lodge should attend these important meetings. Other Lodge members, particularly those new to the Craft, should be encouraged to attend.

Host Lodges will be requested to provide not only the refreshments for the meeting but, more importantly, a large number of their own members.

The monthly MFLA meetings will be interesting, focused, kept "on track" and short. It will be time well spent. They will be well publicized. Forget the past and look to the future. Give MFLA another chance. You won't regret it!
