## Whatcom Lodge Report

February Special: The February Spl. was cancelled due to inclement weather.

*February Stated:* The February Stated was attended by 25 Whatcom members, 1 visitor and 1 dinner guest. In addition to the regular business of the Lodge the EA Degree was conferred on Mr. Kristian Nason. Our visitor was FC Br Alan Olpeanu of Joppa Lodge #112 GL of B.C. & Yukon.

**Degree:** The degree was conferred by SW John Brown with SD Bruce Smith conducting the candidate. The *Apron Lecture* was given by Thom Baughn, the *Working Tools* presented by Barry Podwin, the *Master's Lecture* was presented by the team of Ken Peck & John Browne, who also gave the *Charge*.

*Business:* Under the topic of business Sec'y John Browne moved by PM Jesse Petersen, that the By-Laws of Whatcom Lodge 151 be amended to change the Lodge meeting place from our current location back to the Scottish Rite Hall on State St. where the Lodge met until the mid-1990's. *Field trip:* The lodge brothers took a field trip to the Scottish Rite Hall on State Street to tour the facilities where we may be moving in the not too distant future. While at the Scottish Rite Hall there was some general Q&A about the building and if there would be room for other Masonic groups if they decided to come over after Whatcom Lodge made the move. The Valley of Bellingham Secretary Jesse Petersen said some adjustments would need to be made but that in a year or so accommodation could be made to house them. The general feeling seemed to be that the Scottish Rite Hall would meet Whatcom's needs. The atmosphere is warm and welcoming, the dinning room much richer in feeling and the technology amenities are a step up in quality.

# NOTICE

#### to Whatcom Brethren

A Motion was made at the February 21<sup>st</sup> Stated Communication to relocate our meetings from the Bellingham Masonic Center to the Scottish Rite Hall on State Street.

It was moved by VW John Browne, 2nd by VW Jesse Petersen... as follows.

*I move that Article II, Section 2 of our By-Laws be amended to read:* 

All communications of this Lodge shall be held in the Scottish Rite Building at 1101 North State Street, Bellingham, Washington.

This motion will be up for vote at the **March 21<sup>st</sup> Stated Communication**. Per the WMC: it takes a minimum 2/3 approval by the members present at the time of the voting which must take place at a Stated Communication. Sec. 14.03 B.L. Rev 2013

#### About the amendment...

This motion came about after several years of issues had to be dealt with. Over the last decade we've had to battle vandalism to the building, break-ins to and theft from our storage shed in back. We still get shopping carts and discarded furniture dropped in our parking lot. A few years ago a member's car was broken into and his laptop stolen, very recently three of our members had tires slashed on their cars. Hypodermic needles keep showing up on our lawn and recently the current Rainbow Dad observed males in a corner of our parking lot shooting-up while a Rainbow Girls event was going on - our Grand Lodge Officers were not to happy when they heard about this incident. As you know the Bellingham PD can't post a guard in our parking lot. Paying for a Security Guard to stand by for the hours of our meeting will get pricey over time.

Secondly, over the years we've had to fight and scratch to even put Masonic artwork on the walls of the Lodge room. Recently a member of the Temple Board scheduled to rent the dinning room out to a new Bridge Club, on the same days we meet...brothers coming in to cook our normal premeeting meal, came in to find the dinning room full and they couldn't set up the tables and such. We seem to have this temporarily worked-out but it was a big pain to sort out. The Scottish Rite Hall has room for our lodge and others should they also choose to move over. We'll get a big break in our rent-cost, which will provide us more money to support the three youth groups and other charities. We payed double-rent for over five years at West Maplewood and got only the same service we had before. We understand the TB voted to cut our rent in half but that will not make the surrounding neighborhood fit to reside in.

So, most Whatcom regular officers and members are sick of the neighborhood and not happy with how the Temple Board has treated Whatcom Lodge over the years, hence the proposal to move back to the Scottish Rite Hall. The SR Hall has been renovated, new boiler system, airconditioning, HD videos and sound system. The dinning room is carpeted and looks great compared to the schoolcafeteria-look at W. Maplewood. The main floor lodge room was carpeted a few years ago and has a warmer more friendly feel. West Maplewood has frequent leaks to the roof and the heating and cooling systems are old and expensive to replace. We looked at installing security fencing and electronic gate but the estimates came to about \$50,000, which the Temple Board certainly doesn't have. Plus I think such a walling-in of our place would only put a target on the building. It's time to move on in the eyes of many of us. There will be discussion prior to the vote on this amendment, on March 21st.

### Washington to Host 2021 Conference of Grand Masters

Since 1780, Grand Masters from throughout North America have gathered together "to know each other and to learn how others are meeting and handling the problems of the Fraternity in their Jurisdictions".

In 2021, they are coming to Seattle! Events will be held from February  $20^{th} - 23^{rd}$  at the Westin Hotel in Seattle and at other venues throughout the area This portends to be an exciting opportunity for us to show how we practice Freemasonry in Washington.

With a current membership consisting of the States of the United States of America, including the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico; the Grand Lodges of the Provinces of Canada; the State of York, Mexico; and the American-Canadian Grand Lodge of Germany, the Grand Masters of these jurisdictions represent some two million Freemasons in North America. Additionally, Grand Masters outside of North America, heads of concordant bodies and Masonic organizations, as well as interested observers from many other affiliated groups attend.

The Conference has been the genesis of several programs that have made their way to our Jurisdiction: Long Range Planning, Bikes for Books, Six Steps to Initiation, and the Masonic Model Student Assistance Program come to mind. Additionally, ideas such as the Lodge Leadership Retreat, Outreach Services, and a photography archive have made their way from our Jurisdiction to other Jurisdictions by way of the Conference. The Conference has also been an outstanding forum of discussion for topics such as Millenials & Freemasonry, social media, and improved public relations.

Additionally, Freemasonry worldwide has benefited from the Associations/Committees of the Conference. These include the Child Identification Program (CHIP), Commission on Information for Recognition, George Washington National Masonic Memorial Association, Masonic Renewal Committee, Masonic Service Association of North America, and the National Masonic Foundation for Children.

To make this a successful and memorable event, we are seeking volunteers to be part of the organizing committee. There will be lots of things to do in the areas of greeting, transportation, hospitality, docent, and concierge services – and that's just for openers.
