Words from our Worshipful Master

Brethren,

As I'm sure you're aware, our Grand Master authorized virtual Stated Communications, with necessary limitations, starting next month. He also invited Lodge Executive Committees to submit requests for waivers if they so desired. Whatcom's elected officers, which include the Lodge's Executive Committee, considered the matter and strongly and unanimously were of the opinion that such Stated Communications were not in the best interest of the Lodge at this time. A request for a waiver was submitted to the Grand Master and he has graciously approved our request. You can read his response for yourselves. We, as a Lodge, are once again grateful to the GM for his understanding and concern for the welfare of our Lodge.

One of the hallmarks of Whatcom 151 is the nature of our personal relations. We're brothers, yes, but we're also friends and that sets us apart. These friendships are fostered by in-person, personal interactions. Physically shaking the hand of a brother, sharing a face to face conversation before dinner, enjoying a meal before our meetings, staying afterwards for coffee, a drink, or just visiting in person are things that we regularly enjoy. We do these things, because we're friends and we genuinely enjoy each other's company.

Over time, our perceptions and understandings change. I'll wager that you've heard, and probably felt, that you just heard something in our ritual that you understand in a new way or in a different light. That's certainly true for me. I'm sure that you, the Grand Master and I all look forward to the day when we can take a brother by the hand and greet him face to face. There really is no substitute.

Re: Waiver Request concerning Virtual Stated Communications

Very Worshipful John Browne, Secretary:

On February 11, 2021, I declared that all Lodges would be open in Ample Form for Stated Communications effective April 1, 2021. Such Communications would be over virtual platforms with some restrictions such as no ritualistic work. Further, I gave Lodges the opportunity to request that Stated Communications not be held.

I have received your request to allow your Lodge, to not hold Stated Communications over virtual platforms. While I may not agree that it is in the best interest of your Lodge or the Craft in general to not meet, I am granting your request.

The Executive Committee of Whatcom Lodge No. 151, shall continue to pay necessary expenses, including charitable contributions, of the Lodge. Further, the Secretary shall record those decisions and report all of them to the Lodge at the next Stated Communication.

I strongly encourage the Lodge to communicate with its members over whatever platform or vehicle is most efficient for your Lodge. Further, if you have inquiries about membership you should be in contact with these potential Brothers and engage them in a Six Step type process. Remember the Past. Visualize the Future
