Whatcom Lodge Report

October 21st we held our Stated meeting. There were 15 members on hand, one visitor and 4 guests came for dinner.

Posting Lecture: FCB Mos Roberts completed his FC Proficiency with the aid of WB Ted Schuman, he did a fine job.

New Business: After hearing the finance report WB Thom Baughn moved to contribute \$5,000 to the Whatcom County Food Banks, the money to be divided proportionately among the various locations. Second by Frank Myers, motion passed. There was further discussion

Committee reports: The Lodge Outreach Committee, Chaired by Alex Bruner, with Ted Schuman, is preparing an outline to present to the Lodge; Ted described it briefly and the members seemed to be favorably disposed. WM Ken Peck commented that Grand Lodge has a "Rusty Mason" program on the GL website which Ted said he would review.

The Feast of St. John's Day dinner Committee: Lairmont Manor has been selected as the site, Dec. 27th the date, and catering is being arranged. It will be a Formal Affair with ladies invited. Ted moved and Claude 2nd to commit to a contract with Lairmont Manor for a minimum of 30 people and set the price per person at \$40 (not including the cost of wine) with the lodge to pick up any slack in expenses. An AD will appear in our Newsletter.

November 4th we held our last Special Communication. This meeting was attended by 17 members and 5 guests for dinner.

Masonic Education-program: Off-session at 6:50 pm...SW Terrell Goertz gave a very informative presentation on investments and markets with an emphasis on the long-game and with diversification in the portfolio. This is what Whatcom Lodge is doing.

WM Bruner showed a brief video on the topic of Masonic Faith-Hope-Charity. The video noted in the Bible the word 'Charity' was actually a mistranslation which more properly should be translated as 'Love'.

WM Craig said that he would be appointing one or two members to a Charity Committee, which at it's base contains the Finance Committee as established by our lodge By-Laws. This Finance Committee will establish some protocols regarding how much money would be annually available for charity disbursement establish a priority disbursement structure with Masonic members and organizations at the top, local community needs and so forth down the list.

Official Visit of the Deputy to Whatcom Lodge 151


VW Kurt Gazow will be making his Official to Whatcom Lodge 151 on Thursday Evening, November 16th.


