Whatcom Lodge Report

The September *Special Communication* was held on Thursday, Sep. 2nd and there were 18 Whatcom members in attendance plus 1 guest for dinner. The highlight of the meeting was an active discussion on getting back to our traditional lodge events and visitations.

Off Session at 7:05 pm: WM Craig Bruner called the lodge off-session for some Masonic Education and allowing the brethren to move freely about the lodge room. WM Bruner asked the members to list off the numerous Masonic events, the social ones in particular, in which we try to participate in each year: The following were noted: 3rd Tuesday Luncheon at Rusty Wagon, Every Wednesday Coffee at Scottish Rite Hall, Dec. 27th Feast of St. John the Evangelist, Robbie Burns Night at Prince David Lodge in B.C., The Inst. Of Officers at San Juan Lodge in Dec., Our Summer Lodge BBQ, the Lodge Summer Camping Trip at Masonic Park, the Outdoor FC Degree, hosted by San Juan Lodge, the Outdoor MM Degree hosted at Masonic Park, the Annual Communication hosted by Grand Lodge of WA. In past year's we had Past Masters Dinners and we've talked about having a June 24th Feast of St. John the Baptist event.

Discussion was had about reestablishing these connections and events in light of the pandemic which adversely affected attendance to many of them.

Lodge meals: Discussion was also had on the subject of our per-meeting dinners. JW Monte Thompson said it would be good if the Lodge created a Meal Calendar. That way any brother who might wish to be the cook for a given meeting could sign up. That brother would still be supported by the JW and Stewards and other volunteers. Non-selected meeting dates will be catered. A *Lodge Meal Committee* was set up consisting of JW WB Monte Thompson, JS Bro. Bruce Smith and WB Ken Peck.

We held our *Stated Communication* on Thursday, September 16th and there were 18 Whatcom members, 1 visitor and 2 guests for dinner. The normal bills were enumerated and approved for payment. It was also discussed and authorized for the Lodge to purchase a Printer and Lap-Top computer. The printer to be used at the Hall and the Lap Top for the Secretary to keep the Lodge Records on and to be passed on to his successor in office.

The lodge also voted to have the Secretary follow the WMC and to drop those brothers who do not present themselves for the next degree within the prescribed year. A written notice will be sent out to those affected by the Failure to Advance process. One Brother was held back form FTA statis because his year was affected by the pandemic.

The next meetings for Whatcom Lodge are October 7th and the 21st. Dinner at 5:30 pm and lodge opening at 6:30 pm.




Whatcom Lodge 151 meets on the 1st (special) and 3rd (stated-business) Thursdays of each month.
