Happy Labor Day Whatcom Brothers!

Report of Whatcom Lodge Audit Committee

for adjusted FYE July 31, 2021

Date of Audit: July 20, 2021

Committee: WB Ted Schuman, VW John Browne and WB Ken Peck Items audited were as follows:

1. Income Items – 3 randomly selected checkbook deposit entries were compared with the appropriate bank statements – no discrepancies were found.

Items selected for review were:

Deposit - \$128.00 to WECU, 4/13/21. Comprised of: Dues – WB XXXXXXX

Deposit - \$404,249.00 to WECU, 12/2/20. Comprised of: Wire transfer of proceeds by Whatcom Land Title from sale of Bellingham Masonic Center.

Deposit for \$256.00 to WECU, 1/26/21. Comprised of: Dues – Bro. XXXXXXX and Bro. XXXXXXX.

2. Expense Items – 4 randomly chosen checks were compared with the warrants authorizing them; all data confirmed to be accurate. In lieu of dates, note that the lodge received (ongoing authority to pay bills from GL due to Covid-19 Hiatus) Items selected were:

Check # 1434 payable to Scottish Rite in the amount of \$150.00, Dtd.10/28/20, authorized by warrant # 3258.

Check # 1457 payable to Franks Tax Preparation Service, in the amount of \$415.00, Dtd. 6/11/21, authorized by warrant # 3280.

Check # 1443 payable to Barron, Smith Law Firm, in the amount of \$705.00, authorized by warrant # 3266.

- **3. Dues Receipts** Two receipts were reviewed; issued to Bros. XXXX and XXXXXXXX. These were compared with the corresponding deposits; they were correct in all respects, as shown below.
 - a. Bro. XXXXXXXX ck. # 8355 for \$28.00 (life member) deposited 12/30/20.
 - Bro. XXXXXXXXXX ck. # 8514 for \$128.00 deposited 11/4/20.





Our Annual Whatcom Lodge Audit was devised by a W-151 PM who held a long career in the Banking Field.




A scene of the U.S. Capital Cornerstone ceremony, on Sept. 18th, 1793, as depicted by artist Allyn Cox.


