
Announcements: An opportunity for announcements was provided. District Ten meeting this Sat. Jan 21st at 11 am.

Widows and Orphans Fund

The District 10 Widows and Orphans Fund is a voluntary membership organization made up from Master Masons, in good standing, of the District 10 Masonic Lodges, F&AM under the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Washington. Initial application for membership must be made prior to the age of 75 and membership continues as long as the member remains in good standing in his Lodge and current in his Fund assessments. Annual assessments are determined on the basis of total membership numbers and the number of payments made to designated beneficiaries during the prior year.

The purpose of the organization is to provide funds for widows and orphans of its membership to facilitate the expenses incurred in the death of a member, as provided by the applicant. Under the current by-laws, the fund issues a check of \$500, payable to the beneficiary, as reasonably soon as possible after the passing of a member. This amount was approved by vote of the membership in October of 2013.

Since that time, as we're all aware, expenses have increased. In that light, the Fund's executive committee is proposing, subject to approval of the membership, that the benefit amount be increased to \$1,000. The Executive Committee members feel that we can accommodate this increase without endangering the viability of the Fund.

Members of the Fund will be receiving a ballot in the mail in the near future to vote on this proposal. The decision to utilize mail-in ballots was made to enable all members of the fund to register their position and especially to accommodate those members who would otherwise be unable to attend a general meeting in person.

This fund is an excellent vehicle for Master Masons of this district to fulfill one of their Masonic obligations and we would strongly encourage every eligible Master Mason to consider membership. What better way to practice real Masonic charity than to provide comfort and tangible support to the widow of a brother in a time of sorrow and loss?


