Degree: The Lodge plans to confer the FC Degree on Br. John Little at the Stated Communication on Thursday, March 16th.


Masonic History Education: VW Terrell Goertz gave a talk on how one's perspective or point of view affects how they see and understand a situation or event.

DDGM: VW Craig Bruner reminded brothers of the Wood Coin Program to assist our Masonic Youth.



2 DON'T TAKE ANYTHING PERSONALLY


- Nothing others do is because of you.
