Labor to Refreshment: at 6:45 pm WM Terrell Goertz called the lodge from Labor to Refreshment for a guest speaker. Our speaker was Mr. Marcus Brotherton who has written a number of books related to WWII, the Korean War and the Viet Nam War. Mr. Brotherton spoke on the topic of "How to Live Boldly". 
