Lodge was opened on the 1st Degree at 6:30 P.M. by VW Terrell Goertz who said that the purpose of this Special Communication was to share fraternalism.

Minutes: The minutes of the previous meetings were not read, having been previously approved.

Communications: Masonic Service items including Short Talk Bulletin.

Finance Report: The lodge checking account stands at \$33,039.01 (cash \$1,139.27)

as of 1:06 pm today. Our Edward Jones Investment Portfolio was valued at \$858,698.83 at 1:25 pm, just down a bit from \$885,782.67 on 9/21/2023.

Donation Jar: The food donation jar contained \$270.00.

Feast of St. John the Evangelist... are we going to have one this year? Committee to head it up if Yes. Do we want partner with another body or one of the youth groups? There was some discussion and brothers were advised to think on the topic and come up with possible options.

Thanksgiving...do we, as a Lodge want to attend the dinner provided by Rainbow to show our support? There was a fair amount of discussion. Sec'y Browne suggested that Whatcom Lodge join Evergreen Rainbow Assembly #17 at their Nov 11th Dinner, which is also Veterans Day. The idea had several supporters. Thom Baugh added that the cost of the dinner is "free" but that there will be a Dessert Auction as a fundraiser.

Masonic Education: VW Terrell gave an excellent presentation about the often misused phrase of "the Good Old Days". He presented a compelling case on how this is simply not true for a whole host of reasons. Citing poverty conditions, lack of social networks for many, lack of education, low technology, the poor state of human and animal healthcare. Terrell gave examples from the Ancient World, the Middle Ages, the 18th Century, the 19th Century, and the 20th Century. In reality the "good days" for people are mostly today in the 21st Century. But, we still have a way to go in most parts of the world.

Announcements: An opportunity for announcements was provided. Annual installation of officers to be held at our Nov 16th Stated communication. WB Thom Baugh advised that on Friday BB#44 would host their annual Trowel Exchange with Union-Solomon Lodge and that on Oct. 20th BB#44 would be conferring a MM Degree.

Masonic Education: We could not get the AV equipment to cooperate so the program was scrubbed.


Masonic Youth: WB Thom Baughn gave his usual enthusiastic Youth Report.


Announcements: An opportunity for announcements was provided.

I know there has been reluctance for some Masons to evolve with the times. Many of you do use cell-phones but still do not avail your selves of Masonic information available on the Grand Lodge website know as Grand View. Many do not visit our own Lodge Website where there is information pertinent to our lodge. To log on to Grand View and create your account you will need your GL Id #, which is located on your old plastic card if you still have it. Or, you can contact me and I will provide it to you.

On Grand View you can update your own contact information, add a photo and look at Grand Lodge notices and forms. Shortly I will be setting up the Whatcom Lodge *Dues/Assessment* fees on Grand View. Fifty Year members are exempt but a donation is always welcome. When your payment comes in I note it on the ledger and you will then be able to download your Dues Card as described below. Of course I will help if this process seems daunting. I also have issues with some modern technologic elements. That's why we have guys like VW Kurt Gazow to teach us. Pleas avail yourselves of our available technology talent.

DIRECTIVE TO BE READ IN LODGE

Recently, the Grand Secretary sent out instructions to all Lodge Secretaries regarding entering their dues and assessment information into Grand View. As part of the letter and the instructions that you received, you were informed that the Grand Lodge of Washington no longer issues traditional dues cards. Members can use the virtual dues card which is available on Grand View by accessing the My Portal section of Grand View and clicking on virtual card. It will provide a virtual card and a QR code that can be read by any smart phone and show the current status of any member.

For the new dues card system to work, it is critical that the Lodge not only enter the dues and assessments into Grand View, but also make sure that payments are entered into Grand View in a timely manner. Therefore, I am directing that each Lodge will have their dues and assessments entered into Grand View no later than Friday, November 17, 2023. If you have questions about entering your dues and assessments into Grand View, you can find the instructions on the Lodge Dashboard in Grand View under Resources/Forms or call the Grand Lodge office for assistance.


If you have a member who wants an actual dues card or does not have access to Grand View, they will be able to print it out from Grand View or the Lodge Secretary can do it for him. Once his dues are marked paid in Grand View by the Lodge then the member can simply go to into his Grand View Profile and print out his dues card on a piece of paper or cardstock. There will also be a letter of introduction signed by the Grand Secretary that he can carry with him if travelling to a Foreign Jurisdiction. If a member has not paid his dues by January 1, 2024, he will not be able to access either his virtual dues card or be able to print out a dues card.


