Authorized Visitation to Evergreen Assembly No. 17 IORG



Oct 19th Whatcom Lodge - meeting opens at 6:30 pm.





September Stated Communication...Thursday, 9-21-2023

Lodge was opened on the 2nd Degree at 6:30 P.M. by VW Terrell Goertz who said that the purpose of this Stated Communication was to conduct the regular business of the Lodge.

Visitors: None

Tyler: The Tyler was invited to Tile the outer door and Tyle from the doorway of the Lodge room.

Minutes: The minutes of the September Special Communication were read. This was a visit to the Evergreen Rainbow Assembly No. 17 at the Ferndale Masonic Center in Ferndale WA.

Communications: September MSA, Hands Across the Border Flyer and materials from the Grand Lodge which included Brothers making themselves available for Senior Grand Warden and Trustee positions.

Finance Report: We are doing well with \$31,750.83 in checking at 2:50 pm 8/17/2023. Whatcom 151's *Edward Jones Inv. Portfolio* was valued at \$920,534 at 2.31 pm on 7/19/2023, *in June it was valued at \$893,440.70 and in May at \$874,560.62*. Cash portion is now at \$1,126.29.

Donation Jar: meal donations came to \$229.00.

Finance Report: The lodge checking account stands at \$33,290.01 (cash \$1,139.27) as of 3 pm today. Our Edward Jones Investment Portfolio was valued at \$885,782.67 at 2:50 pm this afternoon. One month ago it was valued at \$920,534. Overall our Annualized Return is 9.21%.

Bills: W #3455 in amt of \$213.35 to Ken Peck for 9/21 Dinner expenses (ck #1634);

Pre authorized: W #3452 in amt of \$285.81 to Bruce Smith for the dinner at Rainbow #17 on 9/7/2023, (ck #1631); W# 3451 in amt of \$350.00 to Scottish Rite for Inv #1767 September Rent (ck #1630); W#3448 in amt of \$230.00 to Sec'y John Browne for Sept. records, mileage & Internet exp. reimbursement (ck #1632). W#3454 in the amt of \$446.00 to Marsh & McLennan Agency for Lodge Officer Liability Ins. (ck #1632)

It was moved by John Brown, 2nd by Don Higgerson to pay the bills, the motion was *approved*.

Installation of Officers: Our annual installation of Officers will take place at our November Stated Communication.

Petition for the Degrees: A Petition for the Degrees from EA Brother Todd Conradson has been submitted. Bro. Todd desires to join a Lodge in Texas where he now resides.

Masonic Education: WM Terrell gave a presentation on the deeper meaning and connections of the Masonic use of Wine, Corn and Oil. He noted in the old world the term corn was used to refer to a variety of grains and salt was even called corn. During Roman times Salt was called Sal from which we get the term salary. Being valuable it was at times used to make payments. The presentation was very interesting.

Masonic Youth: WB Thom Baughn gave his usual informative report on our Masonic Youth. He noted that both the Girls of Rainbow Assembly #17 and the Boys from Chuckanut Chapter DeMolay asked to relay their appreciation for attendance to their recent functions. Chaplain Jerry Hill responded to Thom that he had a wonderful time at those youth events,

Kitchen news: JS Ken Peck rose to give a report on the state of our kitchen. He noted we were in need fo some heating pans. He made a motion that the Lodge authorize \$200 or so dollars for the pans, 2nd by Craig Bruner. There was a brief discussion. The question was called and the motion was *approved*.

Announcements: An opportunity for announcements was given. VW Craig Bruner announced that the District Ten Meeting is scheduled for 11am on January 20th, 2024. Don Higgerson reported that two Whatcom Brother were being honored by the Valley of Bellingham Scottish Rite. VW Craig Bruner was being awarded the KCCH Red Hat and Bro. Alan Smith was being awarded the 33° White Hat. Applause was given. VW Don also announced that the rent for the Hall would be going up to \$375.00 starting in October.

The purpose for which this Special Communication having been completed, Lodge was closed in Due Form by PTM VW Terrell Goertz at 7:50 P.M. / P. & H. P.
