Donation Jar: The food donation jar contained \$270.00. Master Counselor Cody Little, of Chuckanut Chapter DeMolay, provided a plate of brownies for lodge dessert, unfortunately he could not stay. The brownies were excellent.


Charity is a byproduct of love and can be expressed in many forms, it is not just about money. Our world certainly could use more of this special Charity now.
