Special Communication held on Thursday, August 1st

Lodge was opened on the 3rd Degree at 6:30 P.M. by WB John Brown who said that the purpose of this Special Communication was to share fraternalism.

Tyler: Was invited to Tyle from within.

Minutes: The minutes of the previous meetings were not read, having been previously approved, but were available for perusal at the Sec'y desk.

Communications:

5:30 pm—meeting opens at 6:30 pm. Finance Report: The WECU checking account is at \$17,462.34 as of 2:33 pm today and our Edward Jones Investment portfolio showed an amount of \$1,044,930.50 as of 2:46 pm today, with \$1,192.82. in cash. Putting this into perspective. One year ago the value was \$919,183.36, so over the year the net

change is +125,746.98. But keep in mind that these figures do go up & down over time. *None-the-less* we're dong well!

Donation Jar: The food donation jar contained \$175.00.

Masonic Education: WM Pro-Tem John Brown was going to show a video relating to the process of bringing a new candidate into the Lodge and the importance of the vetting process. However, we could not get the sound to work. So, instead, WB John simply restated the multi-step system we have put into practice and covered some of the pitfalls other lodges have encountered when they failed to properly vet interested persons. WB Claude Weedon contributed a story which took place at Lynden/Ferndale Int 56 back when he was WM. WB Ted Schuman also addressed the topic on how it is important make new candidates feel comfortable and valued by the Lodge so we don't lose them along the way.

Widows and Orphans Fund: The WOF executive board elected Beth Heffernan (Bill Kappele's wife) as the fund's secretary / Treasurer. This will be subject to review at the annual meeting later in the year, but there haven't been a lot of Masons eagerly beating down the door to get the job. It's extremely nice of Beth to volunteer.

Discussion followed on the duties pertaining the officers of the Widows and Orphans Fund. At the conclusion of the discussion WB Chris Bonner stood up and volunteered to be considered for President. Bro. Bill Kappele then stood up and volunteered to be considered for Vice President. Action on these offers will take place at the next Executive Board Meeting.

Masonic Youth: WB Thom Baughn gave his usual fine report on the Rainbow Girls and boys of Chuckanut Chapter De-Molay, which will celebrate it's 100th Anniversary this coming January 2025.

Degree: The EA Degree for Mr. Kermit Scott is scheduled for Thursday Sept. 5th.

Expenses for up-coming Lodge BQ were noted, to be purchased by VW Craig Bruner. The bills were enumerated and approved for payment.

Pre authorized: W# 3518 in amt of \$375.00 to Scottish Rite for Inv # 1865 August 2024 Rent (ck #700); W#3519 in amt of \$230.00 to Sec'y John Browne for June Record Keeping. (ck #1701).

Election of Officers: WM Goertz set in motion the Election of Officers for the 2024-2025 Term. The results were as follows: WM = Terrell Goertz; SW = Joe Hayes; JW = Jeff Roskelley; Trea = Ted Schuman and Sec'y = John Browne


Charity: SW Bruce noted that a Church near him provides a Wash Day program for low income families to do their laundry at a laundromat. It was moved by Thom Baughn, 2nd by Joe Hayes to donate \$500 dollars to this program. The motion was *approved*.

Masonic Education: WM Terrell Goertz gave information about several of our more obscure Presidents.

WB Ted Schuman made a presentation on the topic of the need for End of Life planning, it was excellent information.

Northwest shrine Club


Greetings Nobles and Brethren,




