Special Communication held on Thursday, November 7th

Lodge was opened on the 3rd Degree at 6:30 P.M. by WM Terrell Goertz who said that the purpose of this Special Communication was education and fraternalism.

Tyler: Was invited to Tyle from within.

*Minutes:* The minutes of the previous meetings were not read, having been previously approved, but were available for perusal at the Sec'y desk.

*Communications:* Short Talk Bulletin and a few notices from our Grand Lodge. One was a letter from GL regarding Il Lisette copies of the Esoteric portion of the WA Standard Work. Sec'y Browne also read a letter requesting a Dimit from Bro. Vaughn Boatwright which will be handled at our Nov 21st Stated Meeting.

*Finance Report:* The WECU checking account is at \$12,491.81 as of 1:40 pm today and our Edward Jones Investment portfolio showed an amount of \$1,087,929.93....one month ago it was \$1,074,657.89. Our cash portion is now at with \$1,206.22.

*Donation Jar:* The food donation jar contained \$250.00. It was also asked of the Sec'y if an analysis could be done to compare Food/kitchen expenses versus Food Payment Jar income, to which he responded yes.

**Masonic Education:** WM Terrell Goertz presented some history on U.S. Presidents who were Masons. He highlighted in particular President MWB Harry Truman. MWB Truman had served as the Grand Master of the MW GL of Missouri. MWB Truman was asked what was the most satisfying job of his life and he responded be the Grand Master of Masons of Missouri. This presentation was well received by the Brethren present.

*Masonic Youth:* WB Thom Baughn gave his usual fine report. In particular WB Thom noted that members of Chuckanut Chapter are going to attend a Recognition Night on Saturday, November 9<sup>th</sup>.

*Announcements:* An opportunity for announcements was provided. Our local Rainbow Assembly (#17) will be hosting a Masonic Appreciation Dinner with a Dessert Auction on Saturday, Nov 9<sup>th</sup> at 2pm. The dinner is complimentary but bring money for the dessert auction.

### The Stated Communication was held on Thursday November 21st.

Lodge was opened on the 1st Degree at 6:30 P.M. by WM Terrell Goertz who said that the purpose of this Stated Communication was to install the Senior Steward.

*Visitors:* WB Dave Gehrcke Grand Tyler of the GL and WM of BB#44. Presented, Introduced and accorded the PGHs of Masonry.

*Minutes:* The minutes of the previous communication having been approved were not Read but were available at the Secretary's desk for anyone who wished to read them.

*Communications:* We had two Directives from the GM MW James C. Norton Jr. The one dated Nov 9<sup>th</sup> was read by Sec'y VW John Browne. It concerned the requirement of Appointing an Audit Committee following the Installation of the new Term's Officers. The second Directive was read by WM VW Terrell Goertz. This directive relates to the topic of unauthorized copies of the Esoteric portion, in clear text, of the WA Standard work which is reportedly in some lodges and brother hands and which is in violation of the WMC. Lastly there were two cards of appreciation read by the Sec'y. One from the Foothills Foodbank for our \$500 donation and the second, a Thank You, from Kathi Ghers of our D&O Liability Insurance provider.

Food payment Jar: meal payments came to \$218.00.

**Finance Report:** The lodge checking account stands at \$14,577.81 on Nov 19<sup>th</sup>, 2024. On Nov 21<sup>st</sup> at 12:30 pm our Ed Jones Investment Portfolio was valued at \$1.080,499.94. The current cash value is \$1,210.31.

**Bills:** Receipts from Steward Moss Roberts for \$17.65. W #3537 Bill from Bill Kappele in amt of \$39.57 for Webhosting; (ck #1719); W# 3541 in the amt of \$226.17 to Jeff Roskelley for dinner on Nov 21/2024 (ck #1724). It was moved by Ted Schuman, 2nd by John Brown to pay the bills. The motion was *approved*.

*Pre authorized:* W# 3539 in amt of \$375.00 to Scottish Rite for Inv #1891 Nov. 2024 Rent (ck #1720); W#3538 in amt of \$230.00 to Sec'y John Browne for Nov Record Keeping. (ck #1721).

**Proficiency:** EA Bro. Mark Saleeb and his coach Bill Kappele took the floor to perform his EAM Proficiency. Bro. Mark did an excellent job as did his coach Bro. Kappele. We are looking at the Jan 2025 Special Communication for the FC Degree Conferral by SW Joe Hayes.

*Dimit Requested:* Bro. Vaughn Boatwright submitted a request for a Dimit to Sec'y John Browne. Bro. Boatwright is not indebted to the Lodge according to Lodge Records. Since no brother brought an objection the Dimit will be granted per WMC, and signed by WM VW Terrell Goertz.

*Charity:* Sec'y Browne noted that we have received the Annual MSA Green Envelope Appeal. This is to fund their Hospital Visitation Program: Masons visiting wounded and rehabilitating military veterans. Since we had \$450.00 left in this year's charity fund it was moved by WB Frank Myers and 2nd by WB John Brown to donate that \$450.00 to the Green Envelope program, The motion was *approved*. W#3540 (ck #1723)

*Audit:* WB Ted Schuman advised that the Audit Committee met on Tuesday Nov 19<sup>th</sup>. WB Ted read the report to the Brethren. The report was signed by WM VW Terrell Goertz and initialed by Sec'y VW John Browne.

Youth Report: WB Thom Baughn gave his usual informative report.

*Masonic Education:* WM Terrell Goertz introduced WB Ted Schuman. Bro. Schuman read three poems based on Masonry. The first was titled "Grandpa's Old Wooden Chest" Interestingly the chest contained the tools of Freemasonry and the poem noted their uses. The second poem was authored by an Uncle of WB Ted and it covered 'Instructions to a New Mason' and it was excellent. The third was Ted's own composition and was related to Masonic Behavior equaling Masonic Reputation. All three poems were greatly appreciated and Ted was asked for copies to become available.

Without thinking about it, our behavior as Masons creates our reputation as Masons.


